

"Three days and three nights" (Matthew 12:40; cf. 17:22-23)

The 'three days and three nights' are not 3 x 24 hours. Obviously, Jesus spent not three, but two nights when in Hades, where Christ redeemed all souls who were waiting for His coming. Through His Sacrifice He has justified their souls too.

The $\underline{3}$ days can only be understood as an inclusive count, so typical for ancient Jewish dating: from ca.15h Friday until sunset at 18:20h = "day 1" (a portion of 15 Nisan); from Friday sunset until Saturday sunset = "day 2" (16 Nisan); from Sabbath sunset until the Resurrection on early Sunday morning = "day 3" (first part of 17 Nisan). This is a total of 39 hours = $\underline{3} \times 13$ hours. i

⁽row 24) By the end of the 1st century, the Feast of Unleavened Bread was considered an 8-day feast, as Josephus reports:

[&]quot;Whence it is that, in memory of the want we were then in, we keep a feast <u>for eight days</u>, which is called the <u>Feast of Unleavened Bread</u>." (Ant. Book II, 15.1) Written in ca. 95AD this statement by Josephus proofs that the postponement of the Passover Sabbath in Friday—years had been accepted in the Jewish calendar at the end of the first century.

John 14:31c; cf. Luke 22:39a.

Matthew 26:30b, Mark 14:26b, Luke 22:39bcd.

Mark 15:1, "Immediately, in the morning". Also in Matthew 27:1, Luke 22:66.

John 18:28, "Then they led Jesus from Caiaphas to the Praetorium, and it was early morning."

The 12 hours of this night ran from 18:19h, Thursday 06/04/30, to 05:44h, Friday 07/04/30, which is 11 hours of 25 minutes, with the midnight hour starting in 00:01h, but such precision is not possible, the times in this table are all estimates.

Jesus Instructions, and Prayer (John 15-17) were spoken on the road to Gethsemané; during 00h-01h (estimate).

John 18:1, "After saying these things, Jesus went out with His disciples across the winter stream Kidron, where there was a garden into which He and His disciples entered." This garden was the Garden of Gethsemané: Matt.26:36, Mark 14:32. Mark 14:37, "And he said to Peter: Simon, are you sleeping? Were you not able to be vigilant for one hour?". Matt.26:40.

John 18:12, "The detachment of soldiers and the captain and the attendants of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound Him." Matthew 26:47, "a great crowd with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests and elders of the people." Mark 14:43.

John 18:13b-c, "to Annas first, for he was the father-in-law of Caiaphas who was high priest that year."

John 18:24, "Then Annas sent Him bound to Caiaphas, the high priest." cf. Matthew 26:57bc, Mark 14:53b, Luke 22:54bc.

John 18:27, "Peter then denied again; and immediately a rooster crowed." (cf.18:15-18/25-26). Mark 14:26-31/66-72. (c.s.) Peter denied knowing Jesus entering Annas' palace (18:17) and after 1 hour had passed (Lk.22:59), twice in Caiaphas' court (18:25+26).

Mark 15:1, "after the leaders of the priests had taken counsel with the elders, and the scribes, and the entire Sanhedrin, binding Jesus, they led Him away and delivered Him to Pilate." Also in Matthew 27:2, Luke 23:1.

John 18:33, "Then Pilate entered the Praetorium again and called Jesus, and said to Him, 'Are You the King of the Jews?' "

¹⁹ Luke 23:6-7, "When Pilate heard of Galilee, he asked if the Man were a Galilean. And when he found out that He belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Him to Herod, who was also in Jerusalem in those days."

Luke 23:11, "Then Herod, [..] having mocked Him, arrayed Him in a gorgeous robe, and sent Him back to Pilate."

Mark 15:25, "Now it was the 3^{rd} hour, and they crucified Him." Jesus was ca. 6 hours on the cross (\neq 3 hours \neq John 19:14b).

The 12 hours of this night ran from 18:19h, Thursday 06/04/30, to 05:44h, Friday 07/04/30, which is 11 hours of 25 minutes, with the midnight hour starting in 00:01h, but such precision is not possible, the times in this table are all estimates.

John 14:31c; cf. Luke 22:39a.

Jesus Instructions, and Prayer (John 15-17) were spoken on the road to Gethsemané; during 00h–01h (estimate).

Matthew 26:30b, Mark 14:26b, Luke 22:39bcd.

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Mark 14:37, "And he said to Peter: Simon, are you sleeping? Were you not able to be vigilant for one hour?". Matt.26:40. ³⁴ John 18:12, "The detachment of soldiers and the captain and the attendants of the Jews arrested Jesus and bound Him." Matthew 26:47, "a great crowd with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests and elders of the people." Mark 14:43.

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Luke 23:9, "Then he questioned Him with many words, but He answered him nothing."

Luke 23:11, "Then Herod, [..] having mocked Him, arrayed Him in a gorgeous robe, and sent Him back to Pilate."

John 19:14, "it was about *the* (end of?) 6th hour" (→Peter of Alexandria c.s. saw original Gospel in Ephesus; was he wrong?).

Mark 15:25, "it was the 3^{rd} hour and they crucified Him." But if Jesus was 3 hours on the cross (\neq 6h), "it was the 6^{th} hour".
